Practise count in 2's, 5's and 10's in any fun way you can.	Practise adding two 1-digit numbers by drawing tens frames or tens and ones to help you.	Practise playing shops and using money to find totals and change. (upto 20p)	Construct a tally chart of your family's favourite food/toy etc and make a pictogram.
Roll two dice to make a 2 digit number and identify the tens and one by drawing them.	Practise subtracting a 1 digit number from a 2 digit number by drawing tens and ones or ten frames to help you.	Practise telling the time to the nearest 30 minutes using watches and clocks around the house.	Make a game with your family involving adding or subtracting numbers up to 20.
Find 3 numbers less than 50. Order them using these _ < _ < _ _ > _ > _	Play a number bond game with someone to practise all number bonds up to and within 10 and 20	Measure things around the house using standard and non-standard measures. What is taller than you?	Go on a shape hunt and find all of the 2D and 3D shapes. Describe how you know?
Learn about left and right. Think about $\frac{1}{2}$ turns and $\frac{1}{4}$ turns too.	Find $\frac{1}{2}$ and $\frac{1}{4}$ of shapes and objects. If you fancy a challenge, have a go at numbers too.	Explore weighing measures by cooking and baking and using different scales.	Make a repeating pattern from objects, shapes or numbers.
Practise writing numbers in words and spelling them correctly. (upto 50)	Take picture or write down anything you do that involves using your maths skills.

Phonics and Reading Home Learning Grid Year 1

Play some games using a sound from your packs to practise. (Phase 5)	Act out a story with your family – you could make a play!	Ask an adult to ask you some questions about what you have read.	Watch Mr Thorne's phonics (youtube) and find those sounds around your home.	Look through your book for exciting vocabulary. Could you use it in a story?
Read a story aloud to a family member using expression.	Write a book review of the different stories you read. Would you recommend it to a friend?	Draw a story mountain and retell the story into the 5 main parts.	Read a range of books by the same author to spot any similarities.	Go on a sound hunt. Add sound buttons to words that are trickier to read.
Write some questions that you could ask about what you are reading.	Read for at least 15 minutes every day.	Practise reading the Year 1 Common Exception Word lists.	Read the blurb from a book and make a prediction before reading it.	Record yourself reading a book and listen back to hear for muddles.
